and thought of frequently with her phone calls, "just giving you a buzz to check in" to her endless cards for every occasion. She always made sure to include a sticker on the envelope of a picture of something she knew the person loved. She was known to be quiet the night owl, baking peach cobbler at 2:00AM on family vacations. Everyone called her Mimi, no matter their relation to her.

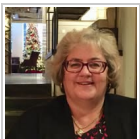
