Cynthia Jean Sattizahn, aged 67, passed away on October 1, 2024, in Carneys Point, NJ. Born on May 2, 1957, Cynthia, known fondly as Cindy, led a life marked by vibrancy and a generous spirit.

Cindy grew up attending Blossburg Elementary School and graduated from North Penn High School. She furthered her education at Mansfield University of PA and Indiana University of PA, which laid the foundation for her lifelong love of learning and community service.

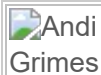

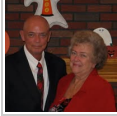
