“How can I put into words the many, many years a special close college friend and one-semester roommate Darlene Kowal was. Life is short. A speck in eternity. She was welcomed into the presence of Jesus at noon March 29, 2026.

She was an instant friend introduced to me by my brother David in the summer of 1977 at a Dallas Baptist College weekend for potential new students.

After moving on campus that fall, the first of many of Dar's pranks was stealing my clothes and leaving an opened umbrella at the shower (which was separate from our rooms). I showed her! ...by wrapping the whole shower curtain around myself and walking back to my room, holding the umbrella.

Other memories of her initiation to college life include throwing water balloons down the hall of the guys' dorm. Then hiding a guy in the broom closet of the girls' dorm while he held a bucket of water (he had planned to retaliate with), from “Ma Paine,” the girls' dorm director. From what I was told, she lived up to her name.

Dressing up like Groucho and Harpo at Halloween was fun and hilarious! I still have a snapshot.

Another fun memory with Dar, was borrowing lunch trays and using them for sleds when it snowed. Such fun! I remember waiting in line to take a turn sledding down a culvert off the interstate. I think once was enough for me...it was a long culvert.

Dar once talked me into skipping class in order to ride in a naval

helicopter which landed on campus grounds and as many as were allowed piled in. The naval air station nearby must have had pilots who needed flight time.

Dar and I loved to sing with my guitar. She was the one who would encourage me to bring it out so a whole group of us could sing together on “the ramp” after supper. Those times were some of the best memories as we all sang Christian songs, a new event in my new life.

She, being far from her home in New Jersey, would sometimes spend weekends with me about a half hour away from DBC, in Everman, Texas, outside of Fort Worth. I still have a snapshot my Dad took one Sunday morning, before church, in our dresses and bare feet.

There are so many more memories I could share. Among them was the semester Dar and I were roommates and after I met my future husband, Dick. On Friday nights, he would call down to our room on the intercom, so she soon nicknamed him my “Friday night guy.” In December of ‘79, she was one of my bridesmaids when I married my “Friday night guy.”

We remained very close friends throughout the past 49 years.
