Frank trained as an electronics technician in the Navy, and carried that skill over as a hobby and later as a source of income in his retirement. Frank also loved watching Notre Dame Football and driving his RV. He enjoyed a good meal out, as long as it did not involve a glass of over-chlorinated tap water. Frank was not only loved by his family and friends, but also those he met in all walks of his life. He was never at a loss for words which made friends smile and family members cringe. He was adored as a husband, Dad, Pop-Pop, brother, uncle friend and super-fan and will be dearly missed by all of his loved ones.
