Kenneth A. Arcidiacono, age 65, formerly of Carneys Point, passed away suddenly and in his sleep on March 27, 2023.

He attended St. James Grammar School and St. James High School, where he played football. 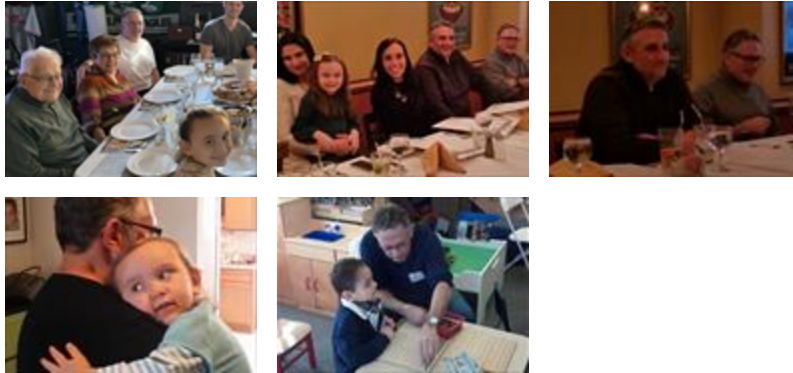
