*Lucy will always be around me in my home from her perfectly stitched artistry (ribbon art, and crocheted Snoopy), kindness to elders (a box of yarn sent to my elder friend Lucille with a half-finished baby blanket and complicated instructions to complete; Lucille completed Lucy’s blanket...not as well as Lucy would have stitched but Lucille was delighted), to our stories together.*

*Lucy loved flowers and we visited a closed greenhouse in the northeast one very cold early spring, peeking through the glass to see rose-shaped Begonias; I had never seen such stunning, robust, colorful flowers!*

*Lucy loved visiting beaches and water fronts. A visit always included the shore, shells, ferry rides, or dock waterside somewhere.*

*With Lucy’s passing, as is her faith and mine, Lucy is no longer diminished, but is whole and healthy in Heaven with her Lord God.*

*Now I smile as I envision my Lucy's face amazed and joyful at her new Holy life. But I sure miss my Lucy.*
