Richard (Dick) E Dennis passed away peacefully on July 2nd, 2023 surrounded by his family.

Born in Swedesboro, NJ on April 30th, 1935 to Clifton and Laura Dennis, Dick lived out his childhood in Pedricktown, NJ where he spent his time on farms and racing cigarette boats, even winning a few races. Voted “Cutest Baby” at age 1, Dick only got cuter as he aged. His trademark bright, blonde hair and blue eyes were outshined only by his big heart and friendly smile.

Dick was a proud Army Veteran where he served as a paratrooper. He even took on the role of quartermaster of the Rakkasans for many years and attended reunions all over the country with his family. While his time in the military was a source of great pride, nothing made him more proud than the titles of “Dad” and “Poppy”.

Dick was married to his wife, Martha, for 61 years. Together they raised their 9 children in Carneys Point, NJ. No family was more notorious on Jefferson Street, whether it was for a helping hand or a candy apple on Halloween, the Dennis clan had you covered.

It’s hard to imagine calling Dick a good storyteller, since he could barely make it through without cracking himself up before ever getting to the punchline, but his infectious laughter would keep you entertained for a 15 minute story that, in theory, should’ve only taken 2. He would bring himself to tears, an emotion you would only see through laughter or through frustration when the Birds would lose on Sunday.

While holidays at the Dennis house were unmatched, summertime was the best time of year. On any given day, the backyard pool would be overflowing with dozens of Dennis children. Dick would beam with pride as he watched his kids and grandkids swim, occasionally having them walk (NOT RUN) him over a beer.

In recent years, as his grandchildren began having children of their own, another

generation of kids got the pleasure of calling him “Poppy”.

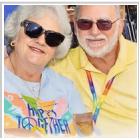
