Robert Joseph Ward “Bob”, age 73, passed away peacefully on May 19th 2026. Bob is a 1970 graduate of Pennsville Memorial High School and a lifelong resident of Salem County. He was a devoted father, grandfather, brother, veteran and friend whose humor, warmth, and storytelling left a lasting impression on everyone who knew him. Born August 31st, 1952 in Mannington NJ, Bob proudly served his country in the United States Army during the Vietnam war and reached E-5 rank. After his service in the Army, Bob was a very passionate disc-jockey and developed many friendships during this time. His career began working for Robbins Instruments in sales and land surveying. Afterwards, he was a surveyor for Richard C. Waddington. His gift for conversation and ability to connect with others made him successful. He never met a stranger, and people would say he could turn the simplest moment into a memorable story.

Outside of work, his greatest joy was his family and sports. Many hours were dedicated to playing and coaching baseball and softball, and he coached both of his children’s little league teams and took great pride in encouraging young athletes to play their best and to love the game. He also coached and played on several local men’s softball and flag football teams where he continued many childhood friendships that carried throughout his life. Bob was an avid Philadelphia sports fan who remained loyal to his teams through every win and loss, always watching with passion and enthusiasm. When he wasn't watching sports, you could see him around town riding his bike or walking. He

loved staying fit and active.

Bob will be remembered for his quick wit, unforgettable stories, generous spirit, and contagious laughter that he brought into every room. He always had a way of making people feel welcome, valued and loved. His presence will be deeply missed by all who knew him.

He is survived by his children Bethany (Matthew) and Scott, grandchildren Neko, Geo and Bram and his siblings Patrick and Bonnie. He was preceded in death by his mother Virginia (Green), Father Robert Sr, sister Joyce (Thompson) and ex-wife Brenda Hanby (Buckingham) whom he remained close friends with until her passing.
